Well...I don't think that the KEK "JAM BOX" is really much of a threat...Considering his neighbors were about ready to toss the old boy out of the building for his last amplifier (which I currently own and DID NOT develop any significant spurs while operated on the same frequency with a like radio). It is clear that the problem he had was simply that his station is located in a building with a lot of old tenants running old TV's and radios. I suspect any type of amplifier in that place will cause problems let alone a dual TE 350 with associated combiners etc. Then there is his ability to continue to use his single cavity duplexer to permit duplex operation (Very important for operation on .435 particularly when Jamming). Last but not least there is the issue of POWER! I suspect a 700 Watt solid state amplifier (operating like my TE at about 50% efficiency) would require 1,560 Watts INPUT or about 113 Amps @ 13.8 Volts... a TALL order indeed. With a 100% efficient power supply (fat chance) he would use up a standard 15 Amp circuit with 13.3 Amps! A more realistic number would be something on the order of 75% efficiency so...how about 16.6 Amps...Time for a 20 Amp circuit! I suppose he could use a few extension cords and do without a refrigerator AKA Green Acres. Then lets see...425 Watts of heat from the 75%

efficiency power supplies plus 758 Watts from the 50% efficient RF section gives us only 1183 Watts of heat energy to loose! Better add some blowers to this baby...Oops another couple of amps from the mains! OK so he has to turn off that BIG screen TV too...Then again it will be all lines anyway! (Giggle) Better keep that window open too! Guess it is fairly cool in the Marina! He better hope so! Sounds to me like we're talking about a bathroom wall heater running there in the bedroom whenever 'ole Frank keys the pickle!

Then there are the rest of us...The "Valley Scrots" who either have 350 Watts and Multi-antenna arrays and the few with "convenient" real estate, or the few with a view of Saddle Peak AND the Amps and arrays! Sheeeesh! So the "Jam Box" will have it's work cut out for it in that department. Then you have to consider the folks local to Frank with "respectable" stations who will retaliate by eliminating any weak stations Frank may want to communicate with...

And LAST but certainly not least there are numerous Mobile Amateurs who have been known to frequent the Marina area transmitting low power Beacon and Aeronautical study signals which have in the past been detected by Frank on 147.435 Mhz. As it has been stated in the past, these types of low power signals can be EXTREMELY detrimental to communications via distant hostile repeaters since Duplex operation is virtually impossible. I might add that some of these weak signal devices have been detected in the past which automatically begin transmit operation when signaled remotely.

Considering the above, I sincerely doubt even Frank would invest the time and money to develop a local station of this magnitude. Rather, I suspect he will negotiate some type of agreement with another remote base whom is willing to give him extended (and I DO mean EXTENDED) access and privileges. In this case, again, some of the above mentioned obstacles would likely be encountered.

In any event...it makes for a good show! And we are waiting eagerly with a mountain of aluminum and silicon for the big day! **KN6KK**

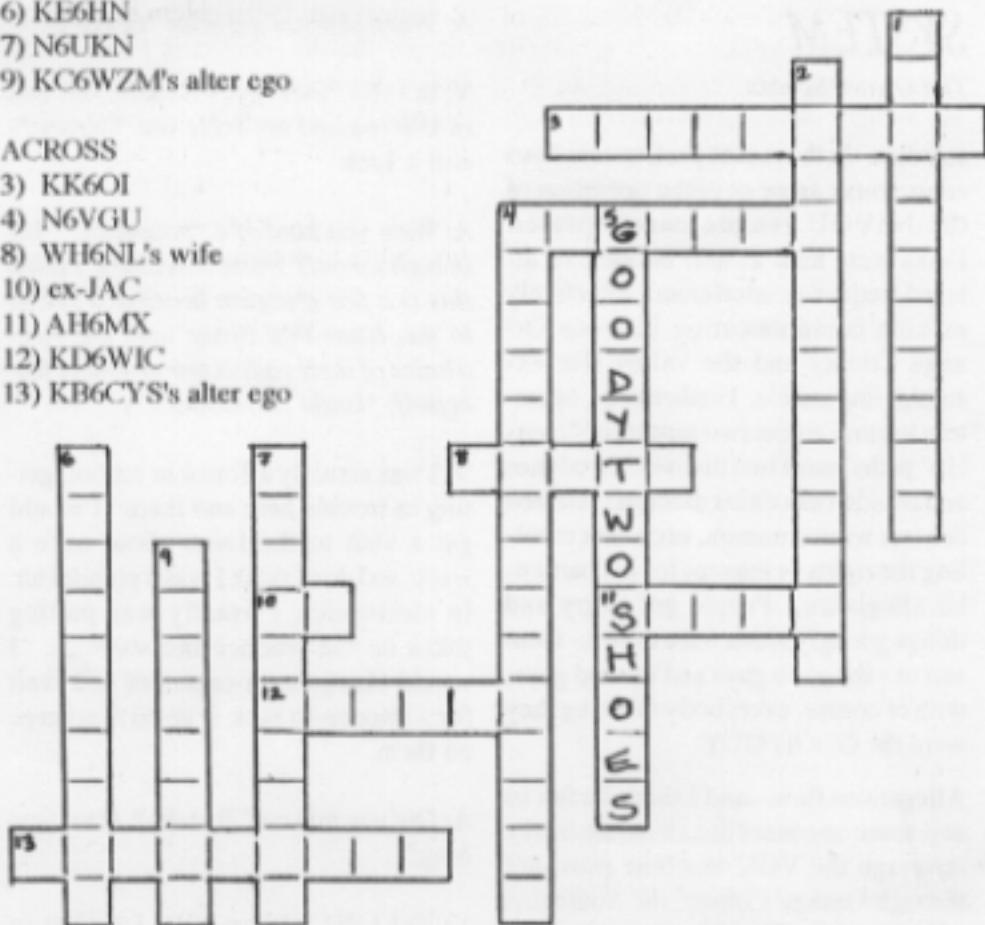

THE VGU SUPER SYSTEM

The Owner Speaks

Readers: In the recent past, tremendous controversy arose over the operation of the N6VGU remote base/repeater. Folks were mad as hell because of alleged frequency interference effectively making communication between Orange County and the Valley (for example) impossible. Furthermore, operators located on the two repeaters' "overlap" paths heard two distinct heterodynes and couldn't use either machine. Heated debates were common, each user extolling the rights or reasons for his particular allegiance. People got angry and things got ugly; sides were drawn - them and us - the good guys and the bad guys, with of course, everybody thinking they were the GOOD GUY.

Allegations flew - and I think its fair to say, some operators did abuse the heavy coverage the VGU machine provided through Orange County, the Southside of L.A. and the Glendale-Pasadena area.

I (KE6ALT) asked Darren (N6VGU) for an interview, but Darren suggested that I write out my questions and FAX them to him I agreed.

The following are my questions and Darren's responses. I have not interviewed Roy Tucker or any other key players involved in the VGU-435 dispute. My intent is not to play favorites but only to provide possible insights to a juicy story. All rebuttals and comments are welcomed. John(ALT)

ALT: Darren, let's start with some questions about yourself and your background. When did you get interested in HAM radio?

VGU: I started into HAM radio as a SWL in the early 80's listening to 146.61 and 147.435 Repeaters. Lazlo (WA6SWG) really started me into it with the Pirate Remote system that was on the 11 meter band. I would go over there and listen to the shows going on while I was getting some radio work done.

A: When did you get your "ticket"?

V: In 1988 I took my Novice license and in 1989 passed my Tech. test. Currently still a Tech.

A: Were you kind of a "poindexter" kid in high school? (Note to readers: I think this is a fair question because it seems to me, hams that tinker with the electronics of their radios are probably like myself; "kinda poindexters.")

V: I was actually a Terror in school, getting in trouble here and there. I would get a visit to the Dean about once a week, so I don't think I was a poindexter. In electronics, I usually was pulling jokes on the teacher and students. I would charge up a capacitor and wait for someone to pick it up to discharge on them.

A: Did you talk on CB radio? If so, how long?

V: Yes I did talk on CB. I started in

1977 and actually left CB a little after the Pirate remote system days were over.

A: What brought you to .435?

V: Well, listening to it and also working with N6OGM (Matt Johnson, who was a co-owner of the 435 machine with KE6HN Dave) at LA Mobile peaked my interest with the system when it was on Hollywood Hills and then was moved to Palos Verdes and now to Saddle Peak. I would help maintain it or move it to a new location. So I guess I was in the thick of it then.

A: Now for the delicate issues. On the air, Roy Tucker expressed his displeased concern over an unauthorized repeater site entry and subsequent repair of his personal property. It's been rumored you felt rebuffed by Roy. And probably in your eyes, this showed his lack of appreciation and gratitude. Furthermore, you are seeking retaliation via the VGU system. I'm sure this story, like most, has two sides. Please give us your version of the events, your opinions and a response to the "retaliation" inference.

V: Ok, let's take this one at a time. I never went into the repeater building. The damage was done on the outside. So I never entered the outhouse shack. The problem was someone cut the hardline and the repeater was still transmitting into an open line. So I went up and repaired it. I felt that Roy was not going to do it or didn't have the time. When I received the message that it was unappreciated that I repaired his hardline after the 2nd time, yes, it did rub me the wrong way.

The VGU System was designed so you can talk any time you wanted to say something. The System actually started by backing up a statement for a user when he stated that he could put up a 145.22 repeater. When that was done, I turned toward 435. It started as a 2nd 435 Repeater but after the TASMA letter I turned it into a 440 Repeater and 2 meter remote base. It really isn't in retaliation, just that I wanted to make a high level system where you can't get

jammed or molested and you can give your opinion.

A: Only one more sensitive question Darren. What was your logic or rationale in choosing your machine's two meter frequency pair? You must have been aware that a coordinated, heavily used, established pair already existed on your choice?

V: Well as you all know, you can't get a 2 Meter pair anymore. There just are none available or so they say. I put it on 435 because Roy Tucker's machine was on one (minute) and off at a drop of a hat. Apparently back then, when you voiced your opinion about the control-ops or Mr Tucker himself, they would either mute you or turn the repeater off. I noticed when I put the system up and on-line that the Tucker System would not be turned off.

A: As I promised, no more "firecrackers". We all are aware of user "interference" problems on repeaters - including your own machine. Commonly suggested solutions include, "turn it off", "keep it on", "where's the power limiter", "it's the FCC's fault" and many others. What are your views on malicious interference and any remedies that you might suggest?

V: Hmmm, this is going to be a hard one to answer because this is 435. If it was a normal repeater you wouldn't have these problems, but this is 435. I really don't know how to get rid of the squeakies and bootleggers unless you wanted to go to a DPL or sub-standard PL and when the bootlegger or squeakies come up, switch the mode of the repeater to special and only the users that have that option installed would use the repeater. Turning the repeater off will get you NOWHERE. You are then just bowing to the unwanted and disrupting service to the users. As for the power limiter, it won't work at all. Roy will turn it on and a station will transmit that is higher than the threshold and make the repeater again USELESS. I really don't know how to com-

ment on malicious interference. I knew when you could not use the input to the 435 Machine, I told the users to switch the remote to the output to get your point across. So there might be malicious interference on both sides. I have given one remedy to attempt to fix the problems of 435 and I have other ways. If Roy wants advice or ideas, he has my phone number.

A: Many of us, including myself, do not fully understand the procedures the Two Meter Area Spectrum Management Association (TASMA) and the Southern California Repeater and Remote Base Association (SCRRBA) use when selecting coordination and frequency allotment. Would you care to comment on any of those organizations and your experience with them?

V: Well if you have ever been to the TASMA meeting, you would know that they are boring. Kind of like going to the dentist for a checkup. Basically you get the paperwork from the organizations and fill them out and hopefully what you ask for will be granted. There really isn't that much to tell about these organizations. You really have to see it for yourself. As for experience with them, I only had that one letter with TASMA and it was resolved. I haven't had any dealings with SCRRBA yet.

A: Presently, what have you got cooking for your system?

V: Well if I tell you, I will have to Kill you. Right now we are working on the 440 and 1.2 Repeater soon to be on the air. We are looking into some other radio sites for links and outputs and inputs. The system is being built in phases, and I am currently up to phase III. Let me tell you this, "You haven't seen anything yet", it just keeps getting better and better...

A: What's your vision for the future of the VGU Super System?

V: My vision. Well the Super System is like cave exploring. You never know

where it will take you.

A: Do you think the VGU system and .435 will ever work in harmony? That is, will they ever get along together and/or work in unison to provide super mega, gigantic, humongous, improved coverage?

V: Truthfully, I don't think we will work together in harmony. Roy Tucker has his opinions and thoughts and I have mine. We just don't see eye to eye on a bunch of things. Roy, you own the equipment, but you don't own the frequencies. They are public for everyone to use.

Thank you for your consideration of asking for my opinions and my side of the story. **Darren N6VGU**

eds: Thanks for helping us with this interview, Darren. Good luck with your coordination and the VGU project. Anyone out there have any comments?

Then there are those who will tell you that your signal sucks, that there is a hum in your power supply, or your microphone sounds like it is up your ass.

Now all this is contingent on the fact that you will make it through the repeater and not be jammed out or talked over. Well the fact is that 435 is an outlet for someone to release all his anger and his frustrations that he has burning inside his gut. Just think of all the times someone released all his anger over the radio instead of killing twenty or so people from 522.

Then there are those who just listen and enjoy the show, that is if all the neurotic jammers and mentally ill bootleggers do not jam the frequency. Those who lack control over their emotions and are starved for attention in their own disturbed, troubled, and irrational way, make the frequency unusable and destroy what otherwise might have been a good show. In their own psychotic way, they even destroy it for themselves.

At one time, there were hundreds of users and ten times that in listeners. Even the jammers would stand by when a good show was in progress. The thing is, it was not just a lot of shows. At times it was informative. Where else could you hear so many diversified specialists in their fields, discuss such a wide variety of topics? And boy could you learn about people. One week two hams would be the best of friends. And next week they would be at each others throat. And if a new female would come on the frequency with a sexy voice, you could just hear all these big strong six foot male hams, being controlled by their six inches, as they drooled over their microphones.

In a given population of people, you will most always find a certain percentage who are manic, and it seems some of them have found a home on 435. (Manic is a generalized term used to describe mental illness and does not mean maniac or raving lunatic. Though you might think differently after listening to 435 for a few days.)

You all know the saying, birds of the same feather, flock together. So the trick is, if we can somehow get these people to realize, that other people are not impressed or dazzled by their display of sickness, neurosis, or derangement. They could just record themselves for a couple of days and then play the tape to themselves, and maybe they would "wake up". (This includes bootleggers.)



Then there are those who are gluttons for punishment. In their own unbalanced way, they want attention so much that they will do anything to get it. Even at the cost of being beaten up, or being arrested because they simply lose control of their mouth over the ham radio. Jobs have been lost and lives have been turned upside down, because they simply do not have the capacity to learn, or to converse with people correctly. And on the other side, people let their dislike for someone get so out of control, that they lose control of having a good time on *hobby radio*.

Now even if you do not consider yourself a jammer or bootlegger, there are things that we can all do to improve our mental health, to bring an equilibrium into our brain, and our life.



First step is mental.



We need to tell ourselves that we are in control of our mind, body, and our emotions. The old saying, "so you think, so you become," has a certain validity to it. If you constantly tell yourself you are accident prone, your mind will start looking for accidents, if not trying to create one. If you tell yourself you always get colds or flu's, it can weaken the immune system. If you tell yourself that this person makes you sick just by listening to him, your body just might respond to your command. So start telling yourself that you are healthy and happy. And that whatever you hear it's just *hobby radio*. Tell yourself that your blood pressure will not go up by listening to @#%&^*~Q*(so & so), and I will not get ulcers or have a heart attack when O+△x^y_b^r^l^l^Q", calls me a fucking #S%+^%O+#@%-%@B@.

Second is Breathing.

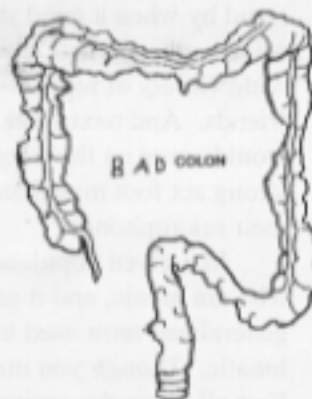
We all need to breathe *long, deep, and slowly*. If you don't use all your lung capacity, you will starve you brain cells of oxygen. This is one of the causes of *old senile age*. And if you breathe slowly, it will help you to relax and think better. As when one becomes excited or mad, his breath is always short, shallow, and fast. Yet when one meditates and connects to his real self, his breath is always slow and deep. And if you breathe through your left nostril, it will help to relax you. Next time you get angry or mad, just try breathing through the left nostril for 3 to 11 minutes. Breathe long, deep and slow and see what happens. You might even enjoy ham radio instead of having a fucking anxiety attack and spreading your shit all over the frequency. (By the way, breathing though the right nostril can energize you when you are tired.)

Third is Diet.

If the statement "you are what you eat" is true, than some of the people on 435 must eat a lot of pig, hog, turkey, fowl, chicken, cuckoo birds, loony birds, and dodo birds. By now I think



most of us know that meat, or anything that has a glandular system and an ass hole, is not the best substance to put into our body. If we eat too many ass holes, we might become one ourselves. (Just listen to some of the bootleggers on 435.) And as to alcohol or drugs, we all know what a stupor and confused state too much can put us in. It has given us all a good show at times, and totally ruined the frequency for almost a complete day.



Now I always try to tell people, "*Digest and eliminate what you eat, before it eliminates*

you." Most of us know what junk food is. And if we eat food, that is heavy, it makes us **heavy**. Eat light and be light. To much caffeine and you will turn into a fiend. To much food can overtax the digestive system. So it's good to give your stomach a rest one day a week. Do you like working seven days a week. Do you not take one or two days a week off. So give your body one day off, and just drink lots of water. If you need something, drink juice, or you can try a good tasting herbal tea. The thing is, not to work the digestive system, let it rest one day a week so it will not go on *strike*. (Chronic jammers and bootleggers may need to take drastic steps, like a good herbal laxative, to flush all the garbage out of their system, so they do not spread it all over the air.)

Fourth is Exercise, a dirty word for some hams. But enough of this for now. Too much to digest all at one time can cause indigestion.

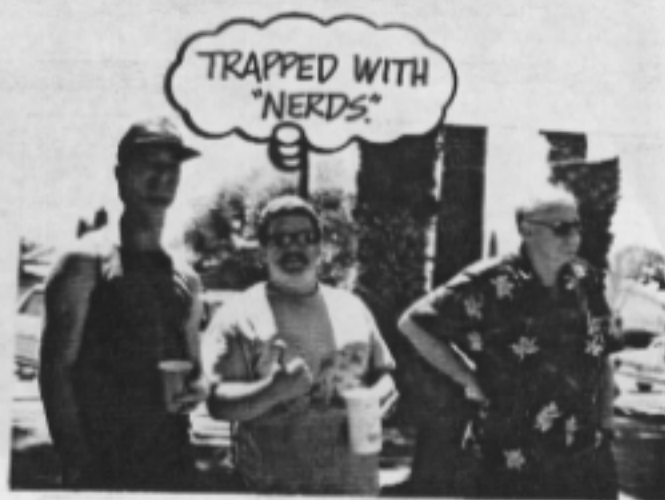

§ 51.7. Freedom from violence or intimidation

(6) All persons within the jurisdiction of this state have the right to be free from any violence or intimidation by force or threat of force, committed against their persons or property because of their race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, political affiliation, sex, sexual orientation, age, disability, or position in a labor dispute. The identification in this subdivision of particular bases of discrimination is illustrative rather than restrictive. This section does not apply to statements concerning positions in a labor dispute which are made during otherwise lawful labor picketing.

(b) As used in this section, "sexual orientation" means heterosexuality, homosexuality, or bisexuality. (Added by Stats 1976, c. 1293, § 2. Amended by Stats 1984, c. 1417, § 1; Stats 1985, c. 497, § 1; Stats 1987, c. 1277, § 2.)

§ 52. Denial of civil rights or discrimination; damages; civil action by people or persons aggrieved; interferences; unlawful practice complaint

(a) Whoever denies, aids or incites a denial, or makes any discrimination or distinction . . . contrary to Section 51 or 51.5, is liable for each and every offense for the actual damages, and an amount that may be determined by a jury, or a court sitting without a jury, up to a maximum of three times the amount of actual damage but in no case less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250), and any attorney's fees that may be determined by the court in addition thereto, suffered by any person denied the rights provided in Section 51 or 51.5.

(b) Whoever denies the right provided by Section 51.7, or aids, incites, or conspires in that denial, is liable for each and every offense for the actual damages suffered by any person denied that right and, in addition, the following:

(1) An amount to be determined by a jury, or a court sitting without a jury, for exemplary damages.

(2) A civil penalty of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to be awarded to the person denied the right provided by Section 51.7.

(3) Attorney fees as may be determined by the court.

(c) Whenever there is reasonable cause to believe that any person or group of persons is engaged in conduct of resistance to the full enjoyment of any of the rights hereby secured, and that conduct is of that nature and is intended to deny the full exercise of the rights herein described, the Attorney General, any district attorney or city attorney, or any person aggrieved by the conduct may bring a civil action in the appropriate court by filing with it a complaint. The complaint shall contain the following:

(1) The signature of the officer, or, in his or her absence, the individual acting on behalf of the officer, or the signature of the person aggrieved.

(2) The facts pertaining to the conduct.

(3) A request for preventive relief, including an application for a permanent or temporary injunction, restraining order, or other order against the person or persons responsible for the conduct, as the complainant deems

necessary to insure the full enjoyment of the rights herein described.

(d) Whenever an action has been commenced in any court seeking relief from the denial of equal protection of the laws under the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States on account of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, or . . . disability, the Attorney General or any district attorney or city attorney for or in the name of the people of the State of California may intervene in the action upon timely application if the Attorney General or any district attorney or city attorney certifies that the case is of general public importance. In that action the people of the State of California shall be entitled to the same relief as if it had instituted the action.

(e) Actions under this section shall be independent of any other remedies or procedures that may be available to an aggrieved party.

(f) Any person claiming to be aggrieved by an alleged unlawful practice in violation of Section 51 or 51.7 may also file a verified complaint with the Department of Fair Employment and Housing pursuant to Section 12948 of the Government Code.

(g) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require any construction, alteration, repair, structural or otherwise, or modification of any sort whatsoever to any new or existing establishment, facility, building, improvement, or any other structure, or to augment, restrict, or alter in any way the authority of the State Architect to require construction, alteration, repair, or modifications that the State Architect otherwise possesses pursuant to other laws.

(h) For the purposes of this section, "actual damages" means special and general damages. This subdivision is declaratory of existing law. (Added by Stats 1965, c. 413, § 2. Specific and positive relief, see § 396 et seq.

§ 52.1. Civil actions for protection of rights; damages, injunctive and other equitable relief; violations of orders

(a) Whenever a person or persons, whether or not acting under color of law, interferes by threats, intimidation, or coercion, or attempts to interfere by threats, intimidation, or coercion, with the exercise or enjoyment by any individual or individuals of rights secured by the Constitution or laws of the United States, or of the rights secured by the Constitutions or laws of this state, the Attorney General, or any district attorney or city attorney may bring a civil action for injunctive and other appropriate equitable relief in the name of the people of the State of California, in order to protect the peaceable exercise or enjoyment of the right or rights secured.

(b) Any individual whose exercise or enjoyment of rights secured by the Constitution or laws of the United States, or of rights secured by the Constitution or laws of this state, has been interfered with, or attempted to be interfered with, as described in subdivision (a), may institute and prosecute in his or her own name and on his or her own behalf a civil action for damages, including, but not limited to, damages under Section 52, injunctive relief, and other appropriate equitable relief to protect the peaceable exercise or enjoyment of the right or rights secured.

(c) An action brought pursuant to subdivision (a) or (b) may be filed either in the superior court for the county in which the conduct complained of occurred or in the superior court for the county in which a person whose conduct complained of resides or has his or her place of business. An action brought by the Attorney General pursuant to subdivision (a) also may be filed in the superior court for any county wherein the Attorney General has an office, and in . . . such a case, the jurisdiction of the court shall extend throughout the state.

(d) Whenever a court issues a temporary restraining order or a preliminary or permanent injunction in an action brought pursuant to subdivision (a) or (b), ordering a defendant to refrain from conduct or activities, the order issued shall include the following statement: **VIO-LATION OF THIS ORDER IS A CRIME PUNISHABLE UNDER SECTION 422.9 OF THE PENAL CODE.**

(e) The court shall order the plaintiff or the attorney for the plaintiff to deliver, or the county clerk to mail, two copies of any order, extension, modification, or termination thereof granted pursuant to this section, by the close of the business day on which the order, extension, modification, or termination was granted, to each local law enforcement agency having jurisdiction over the residence of the plaintiff and any other locations where the court determines that acts of violence against the plaintiff are likely to occur. Those local law enforcement agencies shall be designated by the plaintiff or the attorney for the plaintiff. Each appropriate law enforcement agency receiving any order, extension, or

modification of any order issued pursuant to this section shall serve forthwith one copy thereof upon the defendant. Each appropriate law enforcement agency shall provide to any law enforcement officer responding to the scene of reported violence, information as to the existence of, terms, and current status of, any order issued pursuant to this section.

(f) A court shall not have jurisdiction to issue an order or injunction under this section, if that order or injunction would be prohibited under Section 527.3 of the Code of Civil Procedure.

(g) Actions under this section shall be independent of any other remedies or procedures that may be available to an aggrieved person under any other provision of law. (b) In addition to any damages, injunction, or other equitable relief awarded in an action brought pursuant to subdivision (b), the court may award the petitioner or plaintiff reasonable attorney's fees.

(i) A violation of an order described in subdivision (d) may be punished either by prosecution under Section 422.9 of the Penal Code, or by a proceeding for contempt brought pursuant to Title 5 (commencing with Section 1209) of Part 3 of the Code of Civil Procedure. However, in any such proceeding pursuant to the Code of Civil Procedure, if it is determined that the person proceeded against is guilty of the contempt charged, in addition to any other relief, a fine may be imposed not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or the person may be ordered imprisoned in a county jail not exceeding six months, or the court may order both the imprisonment and fine.

(j) Speech alone shall not be sufficient to support an action under subdivision (a) or (b), except upon a showing that the speech itself threatens violence against a specific person or group of persons, and the person or group of persons against whom the threat is directed reasonably fears that, because of the speech, violence will be committed against them or their property and that the person threatening violence had the apparent ability to carry out the threat.

(k) No order issued in any proceeding under subdivision (a) or (b) shall restrict the content of any person's speech. An order restricting the time, place, or manner of any person's speech shall do so only to the extent reasonably necessary to protect the peaceable exercise or enjoyment of constitutional or statutory rights, consistent with the constitutional rights of the person sought to be enjoined. (Added by Stats 1987, c. 1277, § 3. Amended by Stats 1990, c. 352 (A.B. 2682), § 1; Stats 1991, c. 607 (S.B. 98), § 3.)

§ 53. Restrictions upon transfer or use of realty because of sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, or disability

(a) Every provision in a written instrument relating to real property which purports to forbid or restrict the conveyance, encumbrance, leasing, or mortgaging of that real property to any person of a specified sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, or . . . disability, is void and every restriction or prohibition as to the use or



occupation of real property because of the user's or occupier's sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, or * * * disability is void.

(b) Every restriction or prohibition, whether by way of covenant, condition upon use or occupation, or upon transfer of title to real property, which restriction or prohibition directly or indirectly limits the acquisition, use or occupation of that property because of the acquirer's, user's, or occupier's sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, or * * * disability is void.

(c) In any action to declare that a restriction or prohibition specified in subdivision (a) or (b) is void, the

court shall take judicial notice of the recorded instrument or instruments containing the prohibitions or restrictions in the same manner that it takes judicial notice of the matters listed in Section 452 of the Evidence Code.

DISMANTLING IS JUST FEELS SO GREAT TO GET OFF WITH

By any standards, the letter is a rant. In only two paragraphs and a post script, the four-letter word appears 14 times as an active verb. ("— YOU!! I really mean it, too! — YOU!! — YOU!!")

Seven more times the word appears as a modifier. ("Listen, you —ing IDIOT!") And, all together, there are 28 words you don't see spelled out in many mainstream newspapers. ("—ING EMPTY-HEAD-ED S—")

We get lots of rants here. People send them in response to almost everything that appears in the paper. This particular rant was addressed to "The Editor" and criticized what the writer saw as The Examiner's refusal to write anything good about the president of the United States.

("You —ing REPUBLICAN SCUM can't seem to manage a 'CONGRATULATIONS, MR. CLINTON, Can YOU!!")

Most rants are filled with misspellings, bad grammar and claims of radio antennae being implanted by the CIA in the letter writer's head. This rant is different.

Good grammar, no mention of radio antennae and only one, possibly deliberate misspelling: Dan Quayle's name in a list of "—ing SLIMES, SLIMES, SLIMES: Reagan, Bush or Quail."

This rant even included paradox. ("We're not impressed with your —ing UNKINDNESS, YOUR LACK OF EMPATHY FOR ANYBODY (except yourselves) in the human species...")

So, why am I telling you this? Because, after we'd passed the rant around the office and had a good laugh, I found I sympathized with the rant. Not that I'd have mailed something like that, but...

First, I agree with him or her about the president.

According to opinion-mongers in most newspapers (not just this one), magazines and across the airwaves, Bill Clinton does almost nothing right. In fact, he is apparently the worst, most inept, most spineless, sneakiest, most unaccomplished man ever to occupy the White House. His administration has no achievements, only mistakes and embarrassments.

Why, it's a wonder the U.S. doesn't disintegrate right now from the unprecedented travesty of Bill Clinton.

Take health care. Clinton gets no points for tackling a monster no one else would touch. No points for already fomenting overdue insurance reform. No points for forcing Congress to assess the U.S. health care "system," offer solutions and work toward a national plan.

Hell no. Halfway into his term, Clinton hasn't gotten a health care bill passed. Period. He's an unmitigated bust.

I have my theories about why the nation's opinion journalists — and to some extent its reporters and editors — have chosen to track and judge this president as

Which brings me to the second reason I sympathized with the rant. Rage.

Everybody I know — me included — carries around the kind of anger that produced the —riddled rant we received here. Almost no one I know has found a very good way to vent this anger.

Recently, the Times Mirror Center for the People and the Press reported results of a poll on U.S. attitudes. But for a few modest gains in the areas of race and sexual preference, said pollsters, people in this country are angrier, more fearful and less sympathetic than they've been in years.

"It's not a pretty picture," said poll director Andrew Kohut.

As the poll interpreters put it: "People seem energized by their anger."

That's probably because anger is the one thing almost all Americans have plenty of today.

Hope, security, good manners, unconditional love, a sense of humor and a sense of history — these things are in short supply around the U.S. But anger? We've got more of it to burn than we do cheap, clean gasoline.

The Times Mirror folks singled out what they call "the anxious class": the high-school educated, single mothers and people in service industry jobs who don't have enough money and feel betrayed by Republicans and Democrats.

"Their level of information is very low and they're very volatile," Kohut said.

My guess is, these people aren't much angrier than the rest of us. Just more honest. Further, I'll wager that even people with high levels of information (like journalists) are feeling pretty mean.

After all, the more you know, the more there is to get mad about.

As natural resources go, rage is not a great one to have stockpiled. Until the gang over at Lawrence Livermore Lab designs an engine or bomb that runs on anger, we must all look for outlets.

For some people, the outlet is the anonymous rant. And I guess I can't see the harm, especially when a rant is aimed at a newspaper and comes in written — not hollered — form. Granted, it's a sad commentary on our culture and humanity in general, but, these days, sometimes it feels like the only thing you can say is, "— YOU!! I really mean it, too!"

Debate on contentious issues is in sorry state

More civil listening is essential for improvement

"I wholly disapprove of what you say, but will defend to the death your right to say it," the 18th century philosopher Voltaire supposedly said, expressing the spirit of a time when powerful currents of liberalism were infusing the West.

If Voltaire were alive today in the United States and tried to practice the principle of those words, he could easily find himself at the killing end of a 12-gauge shotgun.

Few Americans will defend to the death the rights of others. Even less nobly, few Americans have the ability to listen calmly to an opposing opinion. The nation is fast becoming a barnyard, teeming with barking, braying, clucking, growling, grunting, raving, screeching, snorting.

The days of felicitous debate are dead and gone. No longer do we appreciate sat journalist Walter Lippmann called the indispensable opposition.

Study an important debate at any level, national, state, regional or local, and you'll find it ramify so profoundly that reaching common ground is next to impossible.

For sure, if you choose to monitor an issue such as abortion, you'll find the discourse littered not only with fetuses, but with the bodies of abortion doctors.

You'll find that freedom of speech — America's greatest treasure — is under attack. When discussion is compromised or led, the potential for human understanding is lost.

And that's the point of this essay: The domain of discussion is vital to human understanding, and human understanding thrives only when we can improve our opinions. How do we improve our opinions? We do so by earnestly listening to the other side, by respecting the other person's right to disagree with us.

Lippmann tells us why we should practice such tolerance: "The end is to find the truth. The practical justification of civil liberty is not that self-expression is one of the rights of man. It is that the examination of opinion is one of the necessities of man. . . . When men are brought face to face with their opponents, forced to listen and learn and mend their ideas, they cease to be children and savages and begin to live like civilized men. Then only is freedom a reality, when men may voice their opinions because they must examine them."

Today we run from other people's opinions. We hide, for example, behind the shrill, self-serving noise of radio talk shows. We've apotheosized the likes of Rush Limbaugh, the nation's most despicable and formidable opinion killer. By doing so, some of us have shut down an entire side of the national debate.

We've become so enamored of our own opinions that our first instinct is to attack those who disagree with us. Rarely do we challenge our opponent on the merits of his or her arguments. Instead, we attack and belittle the person.

Writer Diana Hacker explains the folly of diminishing the opponent when seeking common ground: "People believe that intelligence and decency support their side of an argument. To change sides, they must continue to feel intelligent and decent. Otherwise they will persist in their opposition."

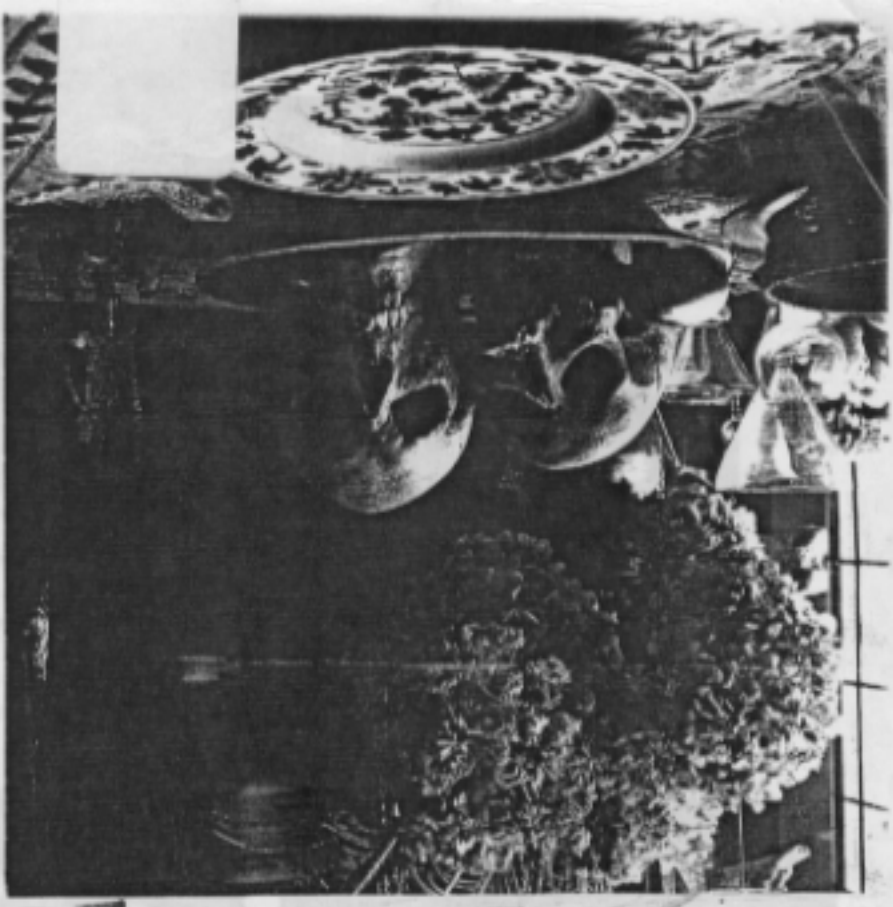
